

Improving Special Education Services (ISES)

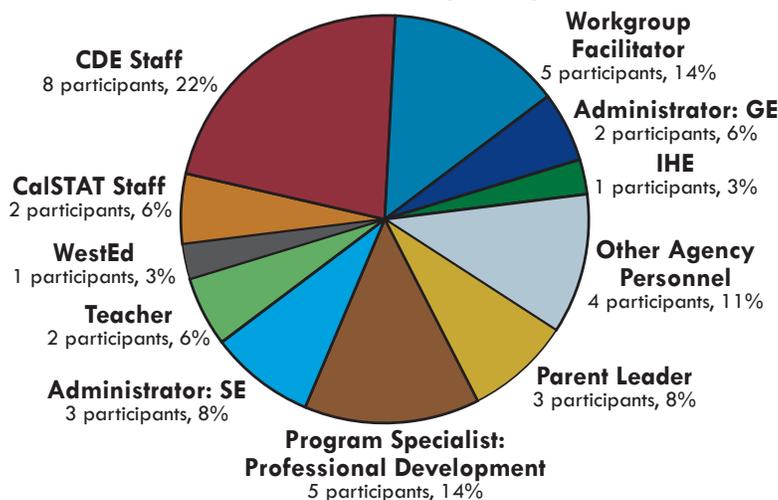

Improving Special Education Services (ISES) is a collaborative stakeholder group convened by the California Department of Education, Special Education Division. The State Performance Plan (SPP), Annual Performance Report (APR), and State Personnel Development Grant (SPDG) are guided by these stakeholders in addressing issues such as personnel development, statewide assessment, and progress monitoring through a unified planning process. The committee is a broadly diverse and representative group of individuals involved in, or concerned with, the education of children with disabilities.

ISES meets twice annually. This meeting was December 3, 2013. The next meeting is scheduled for June 4, 2014.

December 2013, 36 participants

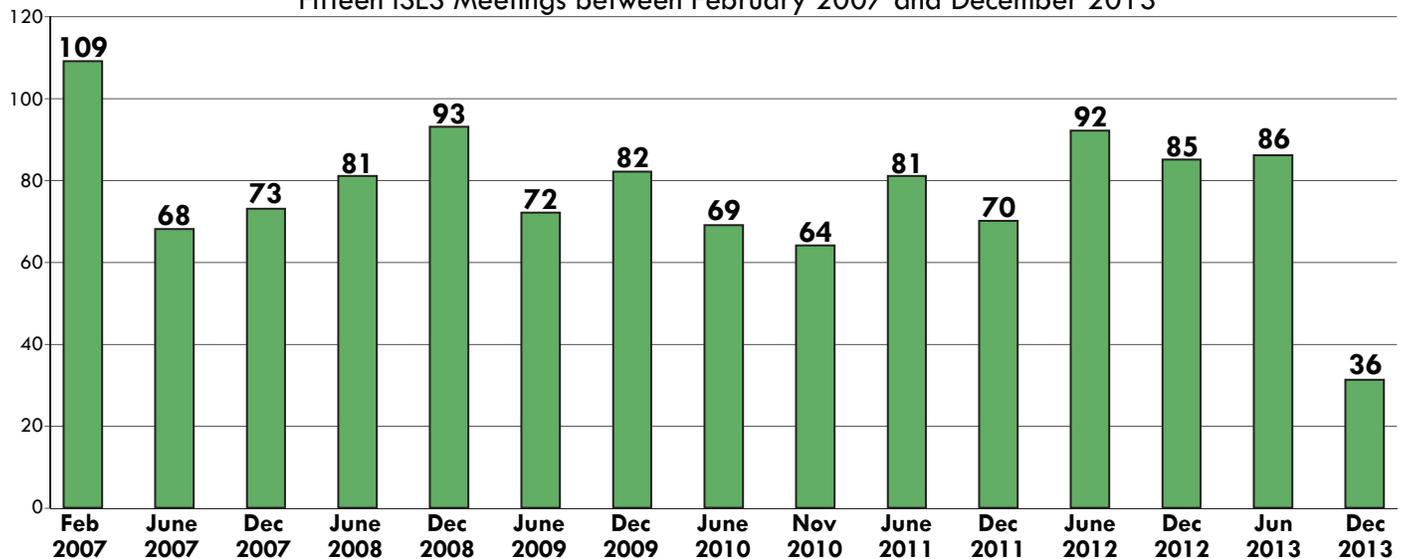


December 2013's meeting was attended by 36 stakeholders supported by 5 workgroup facilitators and 2 CalSTAT staff members.

There were roughly half the usual number of ISES stakeholders attending the December 2013 meeting because it occurred during another important special education conference, the **2013 Secondary Transition Institute: Building a Bridge to the Future** in San Diego (held December 2 to 4).

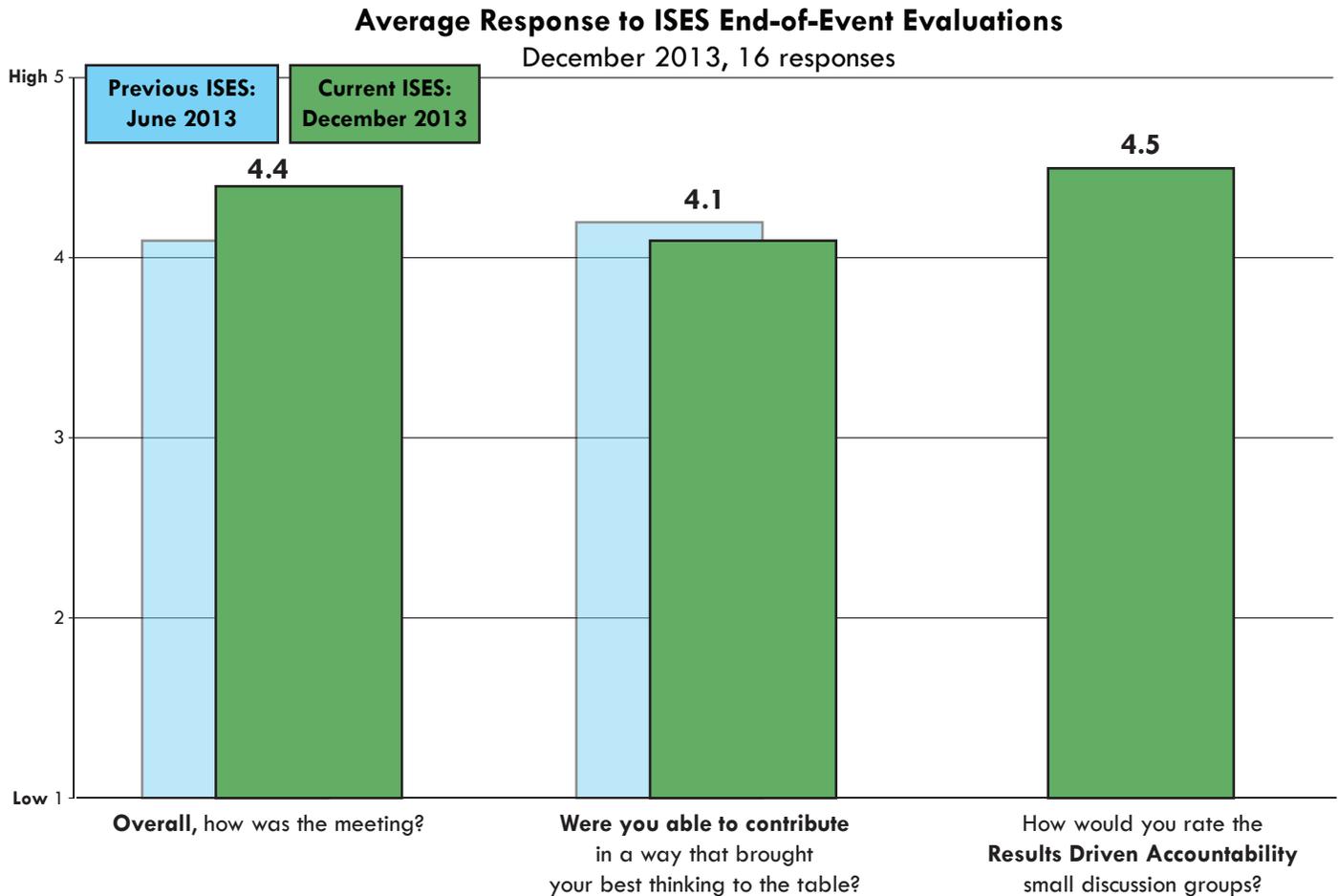
Number of ISES Participants Attending Each ISES Meeting

Anonymous end-of-event surveys were distributed to participants at the beginning of the event and collected at the end. Of the 36 participants who attended, 16 completed end-of-event surveys. Due to the fact that many of the facilitators, CalSTAT and CDE staff feel completing a survey would be inappropriate, this number suggests a response rate of roughly 76% among the 21 participants in other roles.

Participants rated the meeting from one (“poor”/“no”) to five (“great”/“definitely”) in response to three questions. They were also asked to rate Poster Sessions they participated in, which are summarized on page 3.



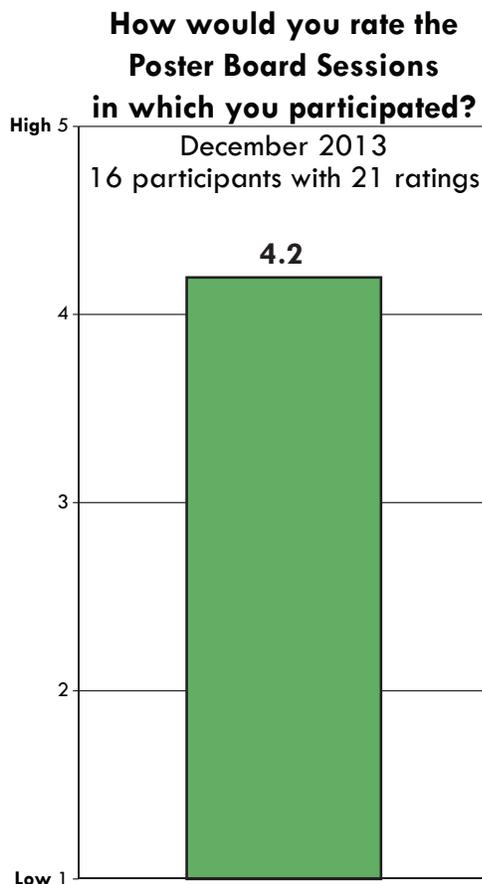
- Overall, the meeting was rated much more highly than the previous meeting. This very high 4.4 rating may be related to the smaller meeting size, which allowed for more active participation in group conversations.
- In response to the question, “Were you able to contribute in a way that brought your best thinking to the table?” responses were down slightly, with 4.1 compared to 4.2 in the June 2013 meeting.
- Another portion which was new in the December 2013 meeting was Results Driven Accountability small discussion groups, which received a very high rating of 4.5.

Poster sessions were also presented to provide stakeholders with an opportunity to speak with the SPP work group leads regarding the improvement activities underway in five key areas.

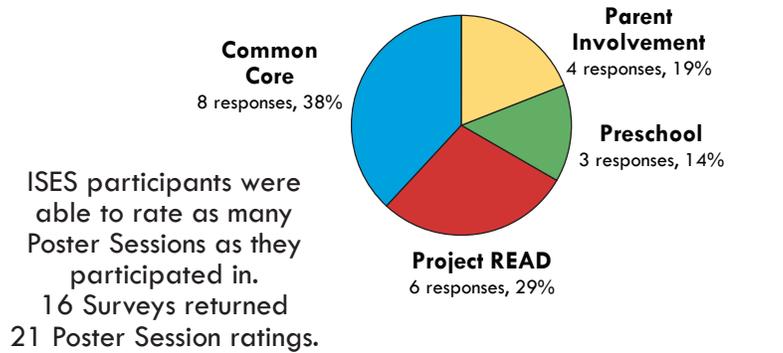

ISES participants were free to circulate between the five poster sessions, so participation was not directly recorded. However, on end-of-event surveys, participants were given an opportunity to rate as many poster sessions as they participated in. As a result, the 16 end-of-event surveys completed yielded 21 ratings, with individual poster sessions collecting between 3 and 8 ratings each. The exception is the Secondary Transition poster session, which had no ratings. The **2013 Secondary Transition Institute** in San Diego appears to have drawn away most ISES participants with a primary interest in Transition topics, along with many other special education stakeholders.



ISES Participant Ratings by Poster Session

- The average of all poster sessions ratings was 4.2, with averages for individual sessions ranging from 4.3 (Preschool) to 4.0 (Project READ).
- The Common Core and Project READ poster sessions received the most feedback.

Post Materials in Advance
